What you will need:

- High thread count cotton
- Non woven fabric
- Matching thread (although I usually use white)
- Pins
- Sewing machine
- Fabric scissors
- Safety pin




Hair ties work really well for elastic. Use only non woven fabric for the inner.

Right side



1)Cut out the pattern. Fold your fabric to make sure that you have two mirror pieces. 2)You should have to 2 pieces for lining, 2 pieces for the outer and 2 pieces for the inner (your fleece or alternative)



6)Turn right sides round and press.
7)Now top stitch along the top and bottom seams.
8)Now top stitch up the centre front seam.



3)Place the outer fabric right sides together. Sew along the long curved edge. Repeat for the lining and the inner(your fleece or alternative) Clip along the curved edge.

9)Fold in the short edges

by 1cm and press. Repeat


4)Now lay your lining on the table right side UP place the inner on top. Now put the outer right side DOWN. Line up the centre seams and pin together. Your outer fabric should over hang by 2.5 cm.



11)Either sew a channel to thread through your elastic or place your hair band in the channel and then sew.




5)Sew along the top and bottom edges only.



If you've not used hair ties then finally thread through your elastic and tie a knot.


Neatly cut out the paper pattern piece. Fold your fabric and pin the pattern piece to your fabric. One pin in each should be enough. It's not a voodoo doll ;)



Seam allowance is how far from the edge you should sew. 1cm is standard. If you sew too close to the edge you risk the seam coming undone easily.

A top stitch simply means a line of sewing that is visible. It is used on edges to keep a seam in place and stop fabric from moving around.

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A top stitch simply means a line of sewing that is visible. It is used on edges to keep a seam in place and stop fabric from moving around. This is the original pattern, I found that the mens size fit me fine. I have made it easier for you by making a pattern piece for the exterior fabric. If you use this pattern you need to extend it on the short edge indicated by the arrow for the exterior fabric.
